
The next academic year's term dates are on the very last page. This lets you know well ahead of time when our INSET days are as well as the school holidays.

Is my child too ill for school? - NHS (www.nhs.uk)

The Government are currently running a National School Attendance campaign.

The campaign's aims include:

- Reminding parents that every school day is important; moments matter, attendance counts.
- Reassure parents that the NHS and the <u>Chief Medical Officer</u> say it is usually appropriate for
 parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses, including
 general cold symptoms like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat.







The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

Pre-School

In Pre-school and in the home environment, it's easy to forget to celebrate your child's smaller milestones, as we get caught up in everyday life. However, celebrating children's achievements big or small is important, as it boosts their confidence and self-esteem. In pre-school we celebrate your child in many different ways. We have a 'celebration wall' for you to bring in good new vouchers, pictures or certificates they have achieved at home. We love celebrating with the children so please continue to share their good news with us.



Reception

This term our topic title is 'Out at Sea'. We started by reading a story called the 'Runaway Iceberg'. We compared an Arctic environment to the one that we live in. We talked about the fact that the Arctic is one of the coldest places on earth! This led us to the 'blubber experiment'. It helped us to understand how Arctic animals survive the cold conditions. The children put both hands in a bowl of icy water, but one of them was covered in lard (blubber). The children were able to directly compare how each hand felt. In warmer climes we have also talked about the diverse range of tropical fish in the sea. The children used bubble wrap in order to add texture to their fish paintings.









Year 1

Year 1 have had a busy start to the New Year. On our first day back, we were surprised to find that a UFO had landed outside our classroom.. When we investigated, we found out that the spaceship belongs to our character in our new book 'Beegu'. In maths, we have been exploring cubes, cuboids, pyramids and spheres. We also had a great time in PE this week when we had a cricket lesson taught by specialist coaches. We can't wait to see what the rest of the year has in store for us.







Year 2

Happy New Year from Pine and Beech Class! What an amazing start to the year! In Writing, we are learning all about penguins in 'The Emperor's Egg'. We are starting to learn our 2, 5 and 10 times table in Maths and in Science we are finding out about plants. As you can see from our photograph, we had a very chilly day in Forest School, with some hot drinks to keep us warm!



<u>Year 3</u>

Over this term, Year 3 will be looking at forces and magnets in science. On Friday, we started to learn how friction plays a big part with forces and magnets. Friction happens where two objects or surfaces move against each other. Our experiment involved using a trainer, an elastic band and a ruler to measure which surfaces have greater friction out of a table, carpet, metal bench, wooden beam and concrete. The children were very engaged and worked together as a team to gather their results. Great job Year 3!







Year 4

Year four have started swimming this term and Maple class has started their violin lessons, which will carry on for the next 10 weeks. We are learning all about the Vikings in History and in Art we are focusing on Jacob Lawrence. Science this term is all about sound and we have already used instruments such as drums and ukuleles to see how sound travels and how that may look.

Year 5

As well as going swimming this term, where the children have shown great enthusiasm and determination, Year 5 has started the New Year looking at the fabulous picture book The Journey by Francesca Sanna. The children have used the illustrations as a wonderful stimulus to their writing. They have used similes, metaphors and figurative language, as well as looking at a balanced argument to decide what the family should do.



Year 6

Year 6 have had a fantastic start to this term and thoroughly enjoyed their first Forest School lesson of 2024 with Mr Meadows. Following an exciting project they worked on in DT last term, they are hoping to work alongside Mr Meadows to build a bird hide!
