Year 1

In maths, we are using tens frames to help us explore numbers to 20 and beyond. Our class book this term is 'the Snail and the Whale' and we have been trying to use interesting adjectives to describe the characters.

This week in Year 2, the children have had a brilliant week back and are settling in nicely!

In Maths, we have been identifying the place value of 2-digit numbers and in English we have been writing predictions of the front cover of a story book.

In Science, we will be finding out about properties of materials and in History, we are looking forward to learning about The Great Fire of London!

Year 3

Year 3 have had a great start to their new year despite the heat. Both classes have been relocated to different parts of the school in order to help them remain cool and all of the pupils must be commended for their maturity and resilience.

Pupils have enjoyed getting stuck in to their new subjects and working alongside their new teachers this week. There has been lots of reading at home already which is great to see. We are all looking forward to the weather being a little cooler next week so that we can be back in our classrooms and more comfortable.

Year 4

We are learning about a new book in writing and are creating our own stories about what we think is going to happen.
