## Holidays

Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Please note that we now request penalty notices from the Local Authority. The fine can be as much as £120 per child, per parent. If it is unpaid, this can lead to prosecution through the Courts.

## **Registers/Lates**

With the school day moving forward, the time the register closes will soon be moving forward to 9am. Anyone arriving after this time will be marked as unauthorised. Ten of these in a ten-week period can result in prosecution through the Local Authority.

Children start to learn the minute they arrive in the classroom. When children arrive late, they are missing vital input from the teacher. This can start your child's day off badly and is disruptive for the rest of the class.

## PUPIL PREMIUM

Did you know that the school can claim extra funding for your child? For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal.

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

You will receive an instant response as to whether you are entitled to free school meals once you have submitted your claim. All you need is your National Insurance Number and a current email address. Please apply online, it takes less than 5 minutes:

## **Reception**

Reception have been focusing on the text Supertato this term. The children have used the book to support with many areas of learning such as Literacy, Maths, Physical Development and Expressive Arts and Design.

The children used their phonic knowledge to describe Supertato and after the classrooms were invaded by the Evil Pea the children created a wanted poster describing what the Evil Pea looked like in the hope he would be found. He had been getting up to lots of mischief!

The children also created traps both inside in outside hoping that the Evil Pea could be caught.







### Year 2

In Science, we have been working really hard on 'Animals including humans'. We have been thinking very carefully about what we need to survive. Then we discussed what we need to make us happy- the children had some amazing ideas. We made posters to show what we had learned.

The workshop covered several key topics: PEGI ratings for gaming; the impact of social media; secure password selection and online safety scenarios. She was very impressed with their maturity, engagement and knowledge base throughout the session and is looking forward to returning later in the year.



Junior school council members really enjoyed their opportunity to visit the Sea Bin in Gloucester Docks last Thursday. We collaborated with Young Gloucester and the building communities project to take some time to learn about plastics in the environment. We got stuck in and helped empty and record the contents of the day. Our aim is that we can share our ideas about recycling with the Phoenix Alliance and eventually introduce some more opportunities to be eco-friendly within our school.



A selection of Year 4's had a great opportunity to attend a Computing workshop at Ribston to program Oh Bots! Using Scratch, they were able to program the Oh Bot to move its lips and say something, move in different ways and even create poems for the robot to say! They had a great time and the Ribston teaching staff were very impressed with their programming skills, considering they were only Year 4! Well done.
