## **Pre-School**

We have explored bubble painting in small group. Each child was given a straw, and the adult demonstrated how to create the bubbles by blowing through the straw into the paint mixture. The adult then showed the children how to catch the bubbles on their paper. From exploring this activity, the children found different ways in which marks can be created. The children also shared their knowledge of colour names. New vocabulary was modelled to the children such as bubbles, paint, blow, splat and straw.





## Reception

The Reception children have settled back into school life brilliantly since returning after Christmas and all of the Reception staff are so proud of their efforts.

They have enjoyed learning about the topic Under the Sea and loved being able to hold [and smell] a reallife lobster! The children have completed some excellent artwork and writing linked to both fiction and non-fiction texts.

The children have also been able to explore the signs of winter when going on a walk, made pizzas, experienced fencing for the first and also been able to work with their friends to create dens and develop their Maths skills over at forest school.













## Year 1

In Year 1 this term we are studying the artist Claude Monet.

We have found out some facts about his work and style, practised colour mixing and tinting to develop our skills. By the end of term, we will be able to combine all our skills to create our own pieces of art.



#### Year 2

We have had a busy start back to school in Year 2. In science, we have been learning about plants and what they need to grow well. In the photographs, we have been sorting beans, plants and bulbs!



## Year 3

In science, Year 3 have been investigating magnets and materials that are magnetic. We made predictions and tested our theories. There were a few surprises too that challenged our thoughts.







## Year 4

Year 4 have had fantastic start to the term. We started off this term learning about our new book by exploring forest school and hunting for clues. Our book is called Podkin One-Ear and it's about a one-eared warrior rabbit. We have enjoyed going swimming and wowing the instructors from last year with our progress. Some of us have even moved up and changed groups! Our fencing taster session was great fun. It is now Cedar class' turn to learn the clarinet and it is much harder than we thought it was going to be! Year 5 have been studying the Artist Henry Moore. We have been looking at his fantastic smooth and holey sculptures, which are often inspired by nature. The final goal of the project is to produce our own clay sculpture in the style of Henry Moore, but, so far, we have been improving our sketching skills. We have focused on sketching natural objects and trying to make sure our sketches are 3D and as detailed as possible.









#### Year 6

Year 6 have been immersed in their History topic this term: they entered a room left empty during an air raid and made inferences about life in World War Two by observing the artefacts left.

They also signed the Official Secrets Act to promise not to share any British secrets they learn while studying Bletchley Park and the incredible work done by the mathematicians working there.
